THE INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE MIDDLE YEARS PROGRAMME

The Middle Years Programme (IBMYP) is designed to give students a well-rounded education based on critical thinking skills, integrated curriculum, thematic units and intercultural awareness. Teachers present each unit of study through one of five Areas of Interaction, which serve to focus student inquiry. IBMYP's Areas of Interaction are:

- *Approaches to Learning (Study Skills)
- *Community and Service Learning
- *Health and Social Education
- *Environment
- *Homo Faber (Human Creativity)



All Areas of Interaction are assessed through a Personal Project completed by the student in grade 10 at Poudre High School.

Beyond intellectual rigor and high academic standards, strong emphasis is placed on the ideals of international understanding and responsible citizenship. IB students are challenged to become critical and compassionate thinkers, lifelong learners and informed participants in local and world affairs.
