Second Semester Schedule Changes/ Add/Drops and Withdraws

Second semester schedules will be distributed on Wednesday, December 10, during third period classes. If a student does not have a third period class, their schedule can be picked up in the Counseling Office.

Second semester schedule changes can be made beginning on Wednesday, December 10. Students must complete any schedule changes by Wednesday, December 17. The deadline for adding classes is Thursday, January 8.

SEMESTER COURSES: Students can withdraw and receive a final grade of 'W' from semester length courses through Friday, February 3. After February 3, all dropped semester length courses will receive an 'F' as a final grade.

QUARTER COURSES: Students can withdraw from quarter length courses (PE and Health), through Friday, January 20. After January 20, all dropped quarter length courses will receive an 'F' as a final grade.

Note: All students must remain in a minimum of 25 credits each semester. PaCE and Teacher Aide classes do not count toward the required 25 credits.

**School Choice Application Deadline
January 30, 2009**

ATTENTION SENIOR PARENTS: A few "details"!

- √ All seniors submit a "legal name" statement for his/her diploma? THIS FORM MUST BE SIGNED BY A PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN!
- √ Are you **sure** at this time that your senior can meet graduation requirements?
- √ Have you or your senior checked on PaCE credit received for 1st semester, and credit needs (hours of work needed) for 2nd semester?
- √ Has your senior submitted a college application(s) to the school(s) he/she plans to attend?
- √ Has your senior submitted his/her "mid-year report" form to Mrs. Mapes (in order to report 1st semester grades to a college)?
- √ Have you obtained a financial aid application (FAFSA) on-line, and are you planning to complete it by Feb. 15?
- √ Has your senior been reading the Guidance Bulletin for graduation information, scholarships, financial aid, and post-secondary information?
- √ Has your senior completed NCAA Clearinghouse eligibility for college athletics? Students MUST apply online at www.ncaaclearinghouse.net. See Mrs. Mapes in the Counseling Office for instructions.

Parents of seniors who are concerned or just need reassurance about their senior's graduation status should contact their student's counselor as soon as possible. Activities that may have an influence on a senior's graduation during the first and second semester of this year are:

- *Failing grades or incompletes*
- *Course withdrawal during 1st or 2nd semester*
- *Loss of PaCE credit due to insufficient work hours*
- *Failure to complete an independent study course*
- *Failure to complete a correspondence course*

While your student's counselor will make every effort to monitor all seniors' progress, the final responsibility for graduation is the student's. Communication with your son/daughter's counselor is strongly encouraged. The counselor is working with 100+ seniors and needs parental involvement to assure timely assistance to seniors.

College In Colorado -

All high school students are strongly encouraged to apply to the College Opportunity Fund at collegeincolorado.com. The state of Colorado has set up a fund for all students who attend a qualifying post secondary institution to receive approximately a \$2,000 tuition discount.

Athletic Scholarships!

College bound athletes who plan to apply for athletic scholarships at an NCAA Division I or Division II institution must register with the NCAA Clearinghouse at www.ncaaclearinghouse.net to determine eligibility.

Academic Lettering

Letters regarding academic lettering at Poudre High School have been mailed to qualified students. The criteria are as follows:

- ◆ Students must attend Poudre High School for a minimum of two semesters
- ◆ Students must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.75 or above.
- ◆ Students must meet good citizenship standards, the same as all other letter winners.

If your student has received a letter of qualification, he/she may pick up the letter "P" from our cashier, Janet Bates, and request a personalized award certificate with Rochelle Morse in the front office. Please have your student bring this letter for verification. Thank you!

STRUGGLING IN MATH?

Here are some tips from the math department on how you can be more successful!

- 1) Talk to your teacher outside of class. Find out if you share a common off-period with your teacher and go get help then!
- 2) Get help from the math tutors. Mr. Ainsworth is available M-F 8:30 - 4:00 p.m. and Mrs. Harms is available M, T, & F 8:00 - 12:30 p.m.
- 3) Check out the online resources for Algebra 1, Geometry, or Algebra 2. Visit www.phschool.com (Prentice Hall) and login to the SuccessNet. Ask your teacher for a login if you do not already have one. Once here, you can find video tutors, practice quizzes, step-by-step examples and more!

Poudre High School INCOMPLETE ('I') POLICY

An Incomplete (showing up as an 'I' on a report card) is not a true letter grade. Students who receive an 'I' are being given an opportunity by a teacher to complete work that must be done to earn a true letter grade. Incompletes are intended for students who are involved in extenuating circumstances which have forced them away from school for a considerable length of time (hospitalization, extended illness, personal tragedy).

A student with an Incomplete has a two-week grace period after each quarter or semester to complete their work and submit it to their teacher. Unless the teacher has received the work necessary for the student to receive a passing grade, an Incomplete ('I') will AUTOMATICALLY CHANGE TO AN 'F' AS A FINAL GRADE. If more time is needed to rectify an Incomplete ('I'), the student and parent should contact the teacher so that a meeting can be arranged with the teacher, student, and the student's counselor.

School Choice Application Deadline January 30, 2009

Poudre School District offers a wide variety of instructional options to meet the educational needs of students. Through School Choice, parents may register their child to attend a school outside their neighborhood attendance area.

Families may submit School Choice applications through January 30, 2009 for the 2009-2010 school year. The online application can be accessed via the district Website at www.psdschools.org under the *School Registration* link. Families that do not have computer access at home can visit any PSD school or the District Office, 2407 LaPorte Ave., Ft. Collins to apply. The order in which School Choice applications are received prior to the deadline does not affect the chance of the student being accepted at the requested school. If the number of applicants exceeds the number of available slots for a particular school and grade level, students will be selected by public lottery.

Please complete one School Choice application form per child per school and submit to each school the student is applying to attend.

Among the areas of the policy are commitment – state law and PSD’s policy presume a family that exercises School Choice plans to keep their student (s) in that school for at least the full school year and also through all grades served by that school. Those wanting to transfer back to a previous school must complete a School Choice application and ask to be transferred back.

Once a student has been accepted into a school, there is no need for parents to resubmit a School Choice application each year. Families exercising School Choice will no longer receive a renewal letter or notice in the future. However, if a child is on a waiting list for a school and wants to remain there, parents must notify the school in writing each year of their desire to remain on the waiting list. ATTENTION 9th GRADERS!! It is not too soon to be thinking about getting the Tdap vaccination! A walk-in, no appointment needed clinic is offered at Larimer County Health Department. The clinic will be open over the Holiday Break; please call (970) 498-6700 for hours. Students must have this immunization to start 10th grade. All your hard work paid off! We are now compliant with the State of Colorado’s mandated immunizations for 10th and 11th graders. Over 650 of you got your Tdap or had a parent sign a waiver. YEAH!

KEEPING UP WITH... PaCE Professional and Community Experience

Thank you to all the parents who came to see us for Parent / Teacher conferences. We really enjoyed the opportunity to visit with you! Many parents have asked the question, "Exactly what is the PaCE program?" In brief, PaCE stands for Professional and Community Experiences. The goal of the program is to help juniors and seniors find opportunities to gain career related experiences in the community. They have an opportunity to "try on" careers while still in high school. There are over 500 businesses in our community supporting PaCE students district wide. PaCE seminars are every Thursday. Guest speakers from all walks of life come in to share their careers and related fields, educational requirements, and what an average day is like. At the end of the student's senior year, a professional portfolio will be produced.

Students may select their level of involvement in PaCE based on the time they have to commit, his/her school schedule, and desire for a paid or volunteer experience. (Summer opportunities are also available.) Grades are based on the student's performance both in work or volunteer experience, and on class assignments. Credits are based on the number of hours worked in a paid or volunteer position. The prerequisites to the program are junior or senior status, and successfully completing the Critical Skills course.

If paid opportunities in career related fields are not available, we ask students to consider internships or volunteer growth opportunities. If you or your company can offer a quality opportunity for a PaCE student, please contact Mrs. Buffington at 488-6069 or Mr. Slawson at 488-6068.

FINAL EXEMPTION POLICY REMINDER

The following rules and procedures determine eligibility for exemption from the final exam schedule:



1. The student has a grade of "C" or better in the class and is willing to accept that grade for the semester.
2. Students must have no more than **TWO (2)** absences in **EACH** of the classes. If they have three or more in **ANY** class, they must take the final exams in **ALL CLASSES**.
3. **THREE (3)** tardies (excused or unexcused) equals one absence.
4. For exemption from finals, absences are based on **CLASS TIME MISSED** regardless of the reason, excused or unexcused. If students are not in the classroom for **any** reason, they are considered absent.
5. If a student who is exempt **chooses** to take the semester exam, the exam will be counted **only** if it raises the final grade.
